


Our Communities

There are 10 Algonquin communities in Canada, nine of them are in Quebec and one is in Ontario. Today the Algonquins have less land. Our land used to include the entire length of the Ottawa River, starting at the headwaters in north central Quebec to its outlet near Montreal. Timiskaming First Nation has the second largest land base with 4576 acres, but in 1851 we had 100,000 acres. Kitigan Zibi First Nation has the largest land base with 45,561 acres. Eagle Village Kipawa First Nation resides on a 52 acre parcel of land on Lake Kipawa.

In our language, Algonquin means Anishnabeg which carries the general meaning of human being and the specific meaning of “real people”. Although the use of our language has declined, there are a few communities that still use it today. We still have Algonquin speakers in our community. In Kitcisakik, Pikogan, Lac Simon and Barrier Lake, the Algonquin language is still very much alive. Most Algonquin communities have programs to promote the language and to keep it alive and in use.
