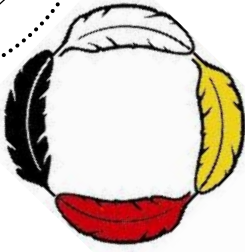
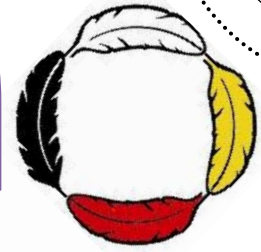

History of TFN Adult Education

The Adult Education Program started in January, 2011. It is currently located at 50 rue Principale Apt. 4, Notre Dame du Nord, QC. This program partners with the Algonquin Nation HRSD Corporation (AN-HRSD) and the Commission scolaire du Lac-Témiscamingue (CSLT) to realize it's goal of successful graduates.

Tony Bacenas has been at the school from the beginning as the main teacher for core subjects such as English, Math, and History. Marjolaine Caron était le professeur de Français Langue Seconde les deux premières années. Depuis l'automne 2013, Julie Tache enseigne le Français. When the program initially started, Kenny McBride provided support to the students. As of December 2015, Dianna Wabie has joined the program as the Adult Education Student Support Worker.

From the beginning the school has attempted to promote a friendly, non-threatening, positive learning environment. This year the school has also become a happier place, with more human interaction. Attendance has improved remarkably and this is now reflecting favorably on the number of course completions. Also, students are no longer apprehensive about talking French and are working harder. A recent addition to staff, Dianna Wabie, will help promote group projects and advance Aboriginal culture.

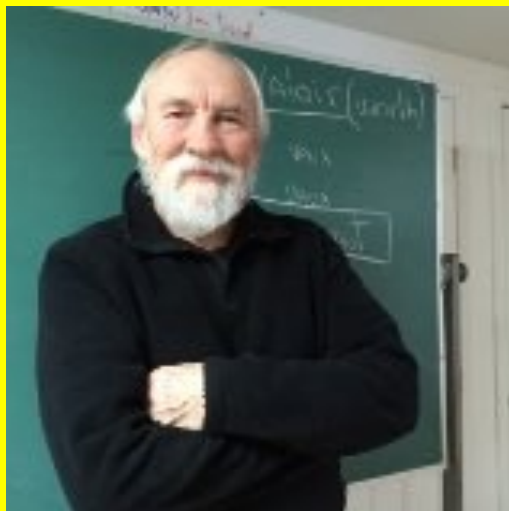

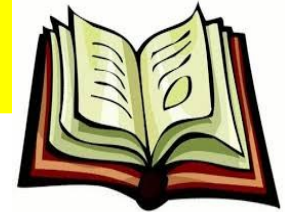
