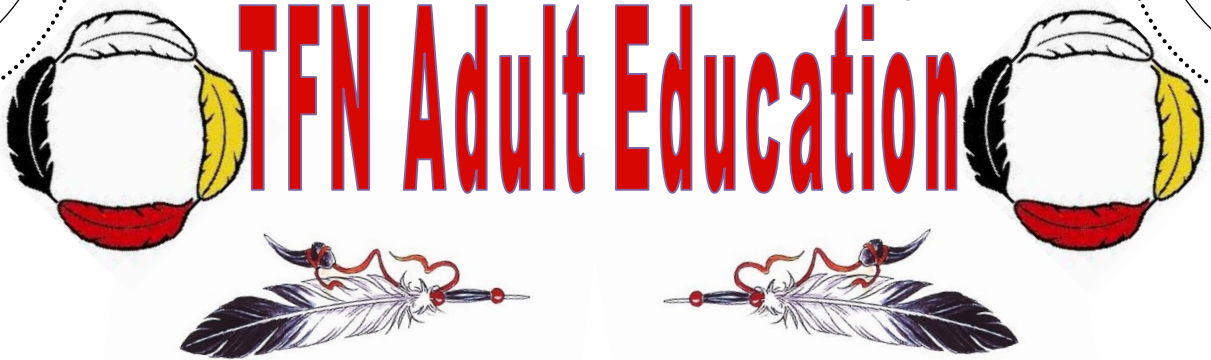

Lakota Legend of the Dream Catcher

Long ago, when the world was young, an old Lakota spiritual leader was on a high mountain when he had a vision. In his vision, Iktomi, The Great Trickster and teacher of wisdom, appeared in the form of a spider. As Iktomi spoke, he took the Elder's willow hoop which had feather, horse hair, beads and offerings on it and began to spin a web.

He spoke to him about starting life as an infant, then childhood, then adulthood and finally old age. He spoke of both the good forces in life and the bad forces. Iktomi said to use the web to help yourself and your people to reach your goals and make use of your people's ideas, dreams and visions. If you believe in the Great Spirit the web will catch your good dreams and let the bad ones go through the hole. Traditionally, it is hung above beds or in homes to sift dreams and visions.
